(Boston) Celebrity Series of Boston will present pianist **Ingrid Fliter on Sunday, November 1 at 3pm at NEC's Jordan Hall**, 30 Gainsborough Street, Boston. Her program honors Chopin and Schumann, who both celebrate their bicentennials in 2010. This is an Aaron Richmond Recital.

This is Ingrid Fliter's **Celebrity Series of Boston** debut.

Born in Buenos Aires in 1973, **Ingrid Fliter** studied piano in Argentina, Rome, and at the Academy "Incontri col Maestro" in Imola. She made her major American orchestra debut with the Atlanta Symphony in January 2006, just days after the announcement of her Gilmore Award. Since then she has made debut appearances with the Los Angeles Philharmonic, the San Francisco, St. Louis, National, Cincinnati, Toronto, Detroit, Dallas, Colorado and Oregon symphonies, the National Arts Centre Orchestra in Ottawa and at the Mostly Mozart, Grant Park, Aspen and Blossom festivals. Equally busy as a recitalist, Ms. Fliter has recently performed in New York at Zankel Hall at Carnegie and the Metropolitan Museum, in Fort Worth for the Van Cliburn Foundation and in Chicago, San Francisco, Detroit, Vancouver, and Kansas City. In Europe and Asia, Ms. Fliter has performed with orchestras and in recital in Amsterdam, Tokyo, Frankfurt, Salzburg, Cologne, St. Petersburg and Berlin and participated in festivals such as La Roque D'Antheron, Prague Autumn and The World Pianist Series in Tokyo.

Ms. Fliter is an exclusive EMI recording artist. Her first CD, an all-Chopin disc, was released in April 2008. Live recordings of Ms. Fliter performing works by Beethoven and Chopin at the Concertgebouw in Amsterdam as well as a DVD of a recital at the Miami International Piano Festival are available on the VAI Audio label.

"For me the most natural way of facing a piece of music is to feel it as telling a story," Fliter says, "And for this I need to try to start feeling and thinking as the composer did. It doesn't mean that I know for sure what the composer wanted to express; I can only wish that educational background and a certain intuition will lead me to respect characteristics of style and expression and to be as credible as possible. Besides I always try to choose to play works that I already feel for some reason attached to."
