(Boston) Celebrity Series of Boston will present **Max Raabe & Palast Orchester** on Sunday, March 4 at 3pm at Symphony Hall, 301 Massachusetts Ave., Boston.

This marks Max Raabe & Palast Orchester's second performance with the **Celebrity Series of Boston**; their debut was in 2010.

Max Raabe & Palast Orchester was founded in 1986 by baritone Max Raabe. Based in Berlin, Max Raabe and his twelve-member band perform more than 150 concerts a year in venues around the world. To date, the group has performed in the United States, Shanghai, Paris, Berlin, Moscow, Tokyo, Vienna, Amsterdam, Rome and Tel Aviv, among others. The group's music embodies that of the '20s and '30s in a uniquely diverse style and that of the "German chansons" from the Weimar Republic.

In 1997 Max Raabe & Palast Orchester celebrated their 10th anniversary at Berlin's Waldbühne, and in 2000 released the album *Charming Weill* on BMG Classics. *Weill* is a homage to the composer Kurt Weill, and was awarded the "Classic Echo." In 2002 the Palast Orchester opened the Viennese Festival Weeks, and in the same year made its USA premiere at Royce Hall in Los Angeles and the Fox Theater in Atlanta, GA. In Spring 2004 Max Raabe and his pianist Christoph Isreal made a New York debut in two solo concerts in the Neue Galerie in New York's Upper East Side. This and the subsequent tour of Los Angeles, Atlanta and San Antonio began their US career. In 2005 Max Raabe & Palast Orchester made their Carnegie Hall debut at Zankel Hall, and most recently, in 2010, went on their first tour through Israel.

The program for tonight's performance of *One Cannot Kiss Alone* will be announced from the stage.
